SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

IRC, ECHO and WS Divisions

SECTION 1: GENERAL

1.0 ORGANISING AUTHORITY

- The Organising Authority of the Sovereign's Cup is Kinsale Yacht Club. The regatta will be sailed from Kinsale Yacht Club from Wednesday 23rd to Saturday 26th June 2021.
- Regatta headquarters will be located on the ground floor of Kinsale Yacht Club. The regatta's official notice board (ONB) will be online on the Event website <https://www.sovereignscup.com> and will be the primary ONB for the event and as backup physically situated on the window outside the Race Office on the ground floor of the club house. In the event of the online ONB being unavailable the backup will become the primary ONB.
- All competitors will be honorary members of Kinsale Yacht Club for the duration of the event.

1.1 RULES AND ELIGIBILITY

- The regatta is governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) of World Sailing, prescriptions of Irish Sailing, the IRC Rating Rule 2021, the IS ECHO Rules, and the IS Progressive ECHO performance handicap system, non-spinnaker class rules (available at registration), class association rules where applicable, the Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions and any changes thereto. In the event of a conflict, the Sailing Instructions shall prevail. This amends RRS 63.7.
- IRC crew limits shall not apply
- Boats shall not race with their anchor projecting over the bow.
- Competitors may be required to display a sponsor's decal on their bow, no further aft than 1.5 meters from the stem of their boat, or fly a pennant off their backstay, no lower than 1.5 meters above deck level.
- The Organising Authority under the auspices of Irish Sailing is the designated ECHO rating authority for this event.

1.2 REGISTRATION

- Competitors shall register between:
 - 1400 and 1700 on Monday 21st June
 - 1000 and 1900 on Tuesday 22nd June
 - 0830 and 1000 on Wednesday 23rd June.
- Competitors in the IRC divisions, with the exception of non-spinnaker IRC divisions and IRC 3, shall have valid endorsed IRC certificates. Irish boats shall have valid ECHO certificates.
- The validity date for IRC certificates shall be on or before 21st June 2021. The Organising Authority may, in exceptional circumstances, accept a later validity date. No changes to IRC Certificates will be accepted after the commencement of the 1st Race.
- The official briefing will take place in the Dinghy Park of Kinsale Yacht Club at 1800 on Tuesday 22nd June 2021.

1.3 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- Notices to competitors will be posted on the official Webpage Notice section and may also be posted on the notice board located in the window of the Race Office and by WhatsApp message to the O'Leary Insurances Sovs WhatsApp group.

1.4 CHANGES TO THE SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- Any change to the sailing instructions or race schedule will be posted before 1000 hrs on 23rd June and before 0930 hrs on the remaining days of the regatta.

1.5 **SIGNALS MADE ASHORE**

- Signals made ashore will be displayed off the main club flag mast, with notices posted on the official notice board.
- When the AP flag is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 60 minutes" in the race signal AP.

1.6 **DIVISIONS**

- Entrants will be divided into divisions which will not be finalised until after the closing date for entries. The composition of the divisions will be determined at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority paying due regard for the need for a reasonable number of boats in each division along with the requirement to have as close a spread of TCC's as possible in each division.

- The breakdown of divisions will be published on the official notice board and on the www.sovereignscup.com web site on or before Tuesday 22nd June. In the interests of fair sailing, the Organising Authority reserves the right to allocate any boat to any division.
- Boats shall clearly display their designated class flags from their stern at all times whilst racing.
- Boats shall show their correct sail number. RRS 77 will not apply. Permission to race under another sail number must be sought in writing from the Race Committee before commencement of the race concerned.
- For the purposes of the allocation of individual race areas, divisions will be divided into the following fleets for the duration of the regatta:

- The order of starts for the divisions within each fleet will be as follows:

- The Race Officer may change the order of starts at his discretion.
- The starting sequence for successive division starts will commence as soon as possible after the preceding division start.

- The decision to sail more than the scheduled number of races per day lies at the discretion of the Race Officer. If International Code Flag "E" is displayed at the finish of the last scheduled race of the day, this indicates there will be an extra race sailed that day.
- On the last day of the regatta, no warning signal will be made after 1500.

1.8 PENALTIES

- RRS 44 will not apply. **A boat that may have broken a rule of Part 2 of the RRS or RRS 31 (Touching a Mark) while racing may take a scoring penalty of 1-point** for that race unless she gained a significant advantage in the race or caused serious damage to another boat whilst racing, in which case she shall retire. When in the same incident a boat has broken a rule of Part 2 and touched a mark, she need take only one penalty.
- **A boat taking a scoring penalty of 1-point under this section shall:**
 - DISPLAY a code flag Q (yellow flag) from the first reasonable opportunity after the incident continuously until 5 minutes after finishing.
 - Draw ATTENTION to the flag as she is finishing.
 - REPORT her acknowledgement in person at the Race Office and identify the nature of the infringement (boat infringed against and/or mark touched, etc) to the Protest Committee by the expiry of the protest time limit. The report shall be on a specific form

available in the Race Office or it may be online on the Event site or it may be provided in the Skippers Pack at Registration. Forms sent by email should be sent to info@kyc.ie

- When a boat is taking more than one 1-point scoring penalty in an individual race the sum of the penalties being taken will apply as one scoring penalty (for example a boat taking two 1-point scoring penalties in an individual race shall have one 2-point scoring penalty applied).
- When one boat in a protest has not already accepted a penalty in accordance with the section above and **acknowledges prior to hearing** an infringement of a rule of Part 2 of the RRS or RRS 31, **she shall receive a scoring penalty of 2-points or 3 points**. This penalty shall be 2 points for boats in all divisions with the exception of the Coastal and Class 1 divisions where this scoring penalty shall be 3 points.
- The race score for a boat that takes a scoring penalty shall be the score she would have received without the penalty made worse by the number of points stated in the scoring penalty. The scores of other boats shall not be changed, therefore 2 boats may receive the same score. However, the penalty shall not cause the boats score to be worse than the score for 'Did not finish'.
- A boat that accepts a scoring penalty may protest with respect to the same incident but her penalty will not be affected.
- A boat that takes a scoring penalty shall not be penalised further with respect to the same incident unless she failed to retire when required to do so.
- The level of penalties (other than time penalties specifically defined in these sailing instructions) for infringements of the rules shall be at the discretion of the Protest Committee and may be disqualification, a time or scoring penalty or no penalty. This changes RRS 64.2.

1.9 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- Protest forms may be available at on-line on Event site, in the Race Office located on the ground floor of the club house or may be included in the Skippers Packs provided at Registration. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there on-line by sending an email to info@kyc.ie or by hand within the appropriate time limit.
- For each class, the protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat in their class has finished the last race of the day.
- Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Parties will be informed by text and/or WhatsApp/email and must supply mobile number, back up number and email number with the protest. Competitors' attention is drawn to RRS 61.1 (a) and the obligations of the protesting boat. Parties with special requirements should notify the Race Office at registration or before racing so they can be accommodated if possible.
- Hearings will be held in a protest room, located in the club house and the representative of each party has the right be present physically or online with a video available on Zoom. A party to the hearing may call witnesses via a video link available on Zoom but not in person in the Protest Room. This is additional to and changes RRS 63. With the agreement of all parties, protests may be heard before the scheduled hearing.
- Notices of protests by the Race Committee or Protest Committee will be posted online to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
- On the last scheduled day of racing a request for redress based on a Protest Committee decision shall be delivered no later than 30 minutes after the decision was posted. This changes RRS 62.2.
- Arbitration may be offered by the Protest Committee under Appendix T.

1.10 SCORING

- The Low Points System of Appendix A4 of the RRS shall apply.
- Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- For divisions 1, 2 and 3, when five or more races have been completed, a boats series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- For the Coastal and Non-Spinnaker 1&2 divisions when four races have been completed, a boats series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

1.11 TIME LIMITS

- The time limit for the Windward Leeward, Round the Cans and Non-Spinnaker courses shall be 30 minutes after the first boat of its division finishes; otherwise, boats shall be scored Did Not Finish. This changes rule 35 and A4 and A5.
- The time limit for the Coastal division shall be ninety (90) minutes after the first boat finishes or at 1730 on the scheduled day of racing, whichever is first
- The time limit for the White Sail division shall be ninety (60) minutes after the first boat finishes or at 1730 on the scheduled day of racing, whichever is first

1.12 DECLARATIONS

- In the interest of complying with Covid requirements declaration forms are not required.

1.13 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- The regatta is a World Sailing Offshore Special Regulations Category 4 event (see www.sailing.org for further details) excluding paragraphs 4.07, 4.17, 4.18 and 4.26.
- Non-compliance with this Offshore Special Regulation shall not be grounds for inter-boat protests.
- Skippers are advised to take note of all local navigational hazards, in particular the Bulman Rock and the unmarked Farmers Rock, both located in the vicinity of the entrance to Kinsale Harbour.
- Competitors are strongly advised to ensure they have a large-scale Admiralty Chart covering the race area between Power Head to the East and Seven Heads to the West. Skippers should familiarise themselves with all navigational hazards in the race area.

1.14 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- A boat or its equipment may be inspected by a regatta inspection team at any time for compliance with the sailing instructions. Failure to comply will result in disqualification from the day's racing. This changes A5.

1.15 RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

- [DP] Except in an emergency, competitors shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all competing boats.
- Racecourse VHF channels are as follows:

- All Committee Boats may display the relevant VHF channel on which it is transmitting race management information. Should a VHF channel become inoperable, the relevant Committee Boat will display International Code Flag 'R', accompanied by five short sound signals, and will then display an alternative VHF channel which will be used by that Committee Boat only for race management information.

1.16 PRIZES

- The overall prize-giving for the Sovereign's Cup will take place on the Balcony from 1830 on Saturday 26th June. Overall prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in each division.

Overall Trophies

- The **Sovereign's Cup** will be awarded to the boat that, in the opinion of the Regatta Committee, has given the best performance in one design or IRC of all competitors at the regatta.
- The **Portcullis Trophy** will be awarded to the boat that, in the opinion of the Regatta Committee, has given the best performance under ECHO of all competitors at the event.
- The **Meridian Armillary Trophy** will be awarded to the 1st boat in IRC Coastal Division.
- The **Non-Spinnaker Trophy** will be awarded to the boat that, in the opinion of the Regatta Committee, has given the best performance in the non-Spinnaker divisions.
- The **Michelle Dunne Prix D'Elegance** shall be awarded to the boat and her crew that, in the opinion of the Regatta Committee, is considered to be the most elegant boat.
- Additional special prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the regatta committee.

1.17 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- Kinsale Yacht Club, its members, employees and agents thereof, volunteers, race officials, and all the sponsors are providing this series of races only on the understanding that they bear no responsibility for any loss, damage, injury or inconvenience to the yachts or persons however arising, directly or indirectly by any accident or wrongful negligent act, default or omission of any member or any other person during the Sovereign's Cup 2021 and any other related activity. Owners shall acknowledge their responsibilities on the official entry form and draw the attention of their crew to this disclaimer before the start of any race.
- Decision to race: the responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone. RRS Fundamental Rule 4.
- The Organising Authority and regatta sponsors do not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

1.18 INSURANCE

- It is the duty of each boat owner to have his boat adequately insured against any risk, including civil responsibility to third parties and to ensure that such insurance remains valid for the entirety of the Sovereign's Cup 2021.

1.19 DATA PROTECTION

- Kinsale Yacht Club has determined it has a legitimate interest to process your personal data for the purposes of the promotion, management and reporting of the Sovereigns Cup. SECTION 2: WINDWARD/LEEWARD COURSE – RED FLEET

2.1 STARTING AREA

- The starting area will be approximately 1.5 nm south east of the Bulman Buoy.
- The exact position may be communicated by the Race Officer on the relevant VHF channel when on station.

2.2 STARTING LINE

- The starting line will be between the red and white pole on the Committee Boat at the starboard end and an Outer Distance Mark (ODM) danbuoy or the flag on a RIB at the port end of the line. An Inner Distance Mark (IDM) may be laid. Boats shall not pass between the inner distance mark and the committee boat when starting.

2.3 STARTING SIGNALS

- Starts shall be in accordance with RRS 26. Successive starts will take place as soon as possible after the preceding starts.
- The race committee will attempt to broadcast Individual Recall (OCS) sail numbers no earlier than one minute after the starting signal, on the course VHF Channel. Failure to make a broadcast or the order in which numbers are broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes Rule 62.1(a) (redress)

2.4 COURSE CONFIGURATION

- **Windward/Leeward: See Diagram overleaf.**
Boats should round marks in the following order with all rounding marks to **PORT** except when sailing through the gate
 - **2 Rounds:** Start 1 - 2 – 3S or 3P - 1 - 2 – 3S or 3P - Proceed to finish
 - **3 Rounds:** Start 1- 2 – 3S or 3P - 1 - 2 – 3S or 3P - 1 - 2 – 3S or 3P - Proceed to finish
- Note, mark 2 may not be laid. If not laid, omit from course description.
- The number of rounds to be raced will be displayed on a Board on the Committee Boat before the Preparatory Signal.
- If for any reason, there is only a single Leeward Mark it will be taken as 3p and rounded to Port
- The Committee Boat may display the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.

2.5 IDENTIFICATION OF MARKS

- Course turning marks may be large yellow inflatable marks. The spreader mark may be a pink or red buoy.

2.6 CHANGE OF COURSE

- When a change of course is required the Race Officer will relocate the mark(s). Minor adjustment to the configuration of the course will not be signalled. This changes RRS 33.
- A significant change of course will be signalled before the leading boat has begun the leg, although the new mark may not yet be in the new position.
- After rounding the changed mark, any further mark to be rounded on the course may be relocated without further signalling.


2.7 SHORTEN COURSE (At the position of the starting/finishing line)

- If the race is to be shortened at the position of the starting/finishing line, a signal boat will position itself at the preceding mark and display Flag F with repetitive sound signals.
- Having rounded the preceding mark, boats shall proceed directly to the finishing line and cross the finishing line from the course side. This is in addition to RRS 32.2.
- At the new finishing line, the Race Committee will not signal a shortened course. This amends RRS 32.2.

2.8 FINISHING LINE

- The finishing line will be between the red and white pole on the finishing vessel displaying a blue flag and a finishing mark which may be a danbuoy or a turning mark.
- Unless finishing, boats may not pass through the starting/finishing line when a blue flag is flying on the Committee Boat.

SECTION 3: ROUND THE CANS COURSE – RED FLEET

- **STARTING AREA**
 - The starting area will be approximately 1.5 nm south east of the Bulman Buoy.
 - The exact position may be communicated by the Race Officer on VHF channel 72 when on station.
- **STARTING LINE**
 - The starting line will be between the red and white pole on the Committee Boat at the starboard end and an Outer Distance Mark (ODM) danbuoy or the flag on a RIB at the port end of the line. An Inner Distance Mark (IDM) may be laid. Boats shall not pass between the inner distance mark and the committee boat when starting.
- **STARTING SIGNALS**
 - Starts shall be in accordance with RRS 26. Successive starts will take place as soon as possible after the preceding start is away.
 - The race committee will attempt to broadcast Individual Recall (OCS) sail numbers no earlier than one minute after the starting signal, on VHF Channel 72. Failure to make a broadcast or the order in which numbers are broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes Rule 62.1(a) (redress)
- **COURSES**
 - The course to be sailed will be notified on VHF channel 72 and will give the order in which the marks are to be rounded and on which hand.
 - The course to be sailed may be displayed on a Board on the Committee Boat.
 - The references and approximate positions of the permanently laid racing marks are set out in Appendix A to these sailing instructions.
- **MARKS**
 - The Kinsale Yacht Club permanently laid racing marks and local navigation marks as far East as Power Head and as far West as Seven Heads will be used as racing marks on the Round The courses. See Appendix A.
 - A large yellow inflatable buoy may be laid each day in order to allow for a windward first leg. If this mark is laid, it will be shown on a board on the Committee boat as “W”. The Race Officer may indicate a range and bearing to this mark over VHF prior to the warning signal. The lack of a VHF call will not be grounds for redress. This amends RRS 62.1(a).
- **CHANGE OF COURSE**
 - A committee boat, or signal boat, displaying International Code flags C over F and a board giving the new mark designation and making repetitive sound signals may be on station near to any rounding mark. The mark designated will be the next mark on the course and shall be the finish. This mark may not have been part of the original course. Boats shall round the mark at which the change of course is displayed and then proceed directly to the mark indicated and finish between it and the nearby Committee Boat. This amends RRS 33.
 - A change of course may be announced on the VHF channel.
 - At the new finishing line, the Race Committee will not signal a shortened course. This changes RRS 32.2.
- **FINISHING LINE**
 - The finishing line for the round the cans course, unless shortened, shall be between a red and white pole on the finishing vessel displaying a blue flag and a finishing outer distance mark. The approximate position of the Finish Line will be notified on VHF Channel 72.

SECTION 4: COASTAL COURSE – BLUE FLEET

4.1 **STARTING AREA**

- Coastal courses will start in the vicinity of the O’Leary Insurance Group (J) racing mark. The exact position may be communicated by the Race Officer on VHF channel 69 when on station.
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4.2 **STARTING LINE**

- The starting line will be between the red and white pole on the Committee Boat at the starboard end and an Outer Distance Mark (ODM) danbuoy or the flag on a RIB at the port end of the line. An Inner Distance Mark (IDM) may be laid. Boats shall not pass between the inner distance mark and the committee boat when starting.

4.3 **STARTING SIGNALS**

- Starts shall be in accordance with RRS 26.
- The race committee will attempt to broadcast Individual Recall (OCS) sail numbers no earlier than one minute after the starting signal, on VHF Channel 69. Failure to make a broadcast or the order in which numbers are broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes Rule 62.1(a) (redress)

4.4 **COURSES**

- The course to be sailed will be notified on channel 69 and will give the order in which the marks are to be rounded and on which hand.
- The course to be sailed may be displayed on a Board on the Committee Boat.
- The references and approximate positions of the permanently laid racing marks are set out in Appendix A to these sailing instructions.

4.5 **MARKS**

- The Kinsale Yacht Club permanently laid racing marks and local navigation marks as far East as Power Head and as far West as Seven Heads will be used as racing marks on the coastal courses. See Appendix A.
- A round RED buoy may be laid each day in order to allow for a windward first leg. If this mark is laid, it will be shown on a board on the Committee boat as “W”. The Race Officer may indicate a range and bearing to this mark over VHF prior to the warning signal. The lack of a VHF call will not be grounds for redress. This amends RRS 62.1(a).

4.6 **CHANGE OF COURSE**

- A committee boat, or signal boat, displaying International Code flags C over F and a board giving the new mark designation and making repetitive sound signals may be on station near to any rounding mark. The mark designated will be the next mark on the course and shall be the finish. This mark may not have been part of the original course. Boats shall round the mark at which the change of course is displayed and then proceed directly to the mark indicated and finish between it and the nearby Committee Boat. This amends RRS 33.
- A change of course may be announced on the VHF channel.
- At the new finishing line, the Race Committee will not signal a shortened course. This changes RRS 32.2.

4.7 **FINISHING LINE**

- The finishing line will be, unless shortened, between a red and white pole on the finishing vessel displaying a blue flag and the Axiom mark.

SECTION 5: ROUND THE CANS COURSE – GREEN FLEET

- **STARTING AREA**
 - The starting area will be in the vicinity of the O’Leary Insurance Group (J) racing mark. The exact position may be communicated by the Race Officer on VHF channel 71 when on station.
- **STARTING LINE**
 - The starting line will be between the red and white pole on the Committee Boat at the starboard end and an Outer Distance Mark (ODM) danbuoy or the flag on a RIB at the port end of the line. An Inner Distance Mark (IDM) may be laid. Boats shall not pass between the inner distance mark and the committee boat when starting.
- **STARTING SIGNALS**
 - Starts shall be in accordance with RRS 26.
 - The race committee will attempt to broadcast Individual Recall (OCS) sail numbers no earlier than one minute after the starting signal, on VHF Channel 71. Failure to make a broadcast or the order in which numbers are broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes Rule 62.1(a) (redress)
- **COURSES**
 - The course to be sailed will be notified on VHF channel 71 and will give the order in which the marks are to be rounded and on which hand.
 - The course to be sailed may be displayed on a Board on the Committee Boat.
 - The references and approximate positions of the permanently laid racing marks are set out in Appendix A to these sailing instructions.
- **MARKS**
 - The Kinsale Yacht Club permanently laid racing marks and local navigation marks as far East as Power Head and as far West as Seven Heads will be used as racing marks on the Round The courses. See Appendix A.
 - A large RED inflatable buoy may be laid each day in order to allow for a windward first leg. If this mark is laid, it will be shown on a board on the Committee boat as “W”. The Race Officer may indicate a range and bearing to this mark over VHF prior to the warning signal. The lack of a VHF call will not be grounds for redress. This amends RRS 62.1(a).
- **CHANGE OF COURSE**
 - A committee boat, or signal boat, displaying International Code flags C over F and a board giving the new mark designation and making repetitive sound signals may be on station near to any rounding mark. The mark designated will be the next mark on the course and shall be the finish. This mark may not have been part of the original course. Boats shall round the mark at which the change of course is displayed and then proceed directly to the mark indicated and finish between it and the nearby Committee Boat. This amends RRS 33.
 - A change of course may be announced on the VHF channel.
 - At the new finishing line, the Race Committee will not signal a shortened course. This changes RRS 32.2.
- **FINISHING LINE**
 - The finishing line for the round the cans course, unless shortened, shall be between a red and white pole on the finishing vessel displaying a blue flag and a finishing outer distance mark. The approximate position of the Finish Line will be notified on VHF Channel 71.

5.1 **STARTING AREA**

- Non-spinnaker races will start in Kinsale Harbour between Charles Fort & Bulman Buoy.
- The Race Officer may advise competitors of his location on VHF channel 68.

5.2 **STARTING LINE**

- The starting line will be between the red and white pole on the Committee Boat at the starboard end and an Outer Distance Mark (ODM) danbuoy or the flag on a RIB at the port end of the line. An Inner Distance Mark (IDM) may be laid. Boats shall not pass between the inner distance mark and the committee boat when starting.

5.3 **STARTING SIGNALS**

- Starts shall be in accordance with RRS 26. Successive starts will take place as soon as possible after the preceding start is away.
- The race committee will attempt to broadcast Individual Recall (OCS) sail numbers no earlier than one minute after the starting signal, on VHF Channel 68. Failure to make a broadcast or the order in which numbers are broadcast will not be grounds for redress. This changes Rule 62.1(a) (redress)

5.4 **COURSES**

- The course to be sailed will be notified on VHF channel 68 and will give the order in which the marks are to be rounded and on which hand.
- The course to be sailed may be displayed on a Board on the Committee Boat.
- The references and approximate positions of the marks are set out in Appendix A to these sailing instructions.

5.5 **MARKS**

- The Kinsale Yacht Club permanently laid racing marks and local navigation marks as far East as Power Head and as far West as Seven Heads will be used as racing marks on the round the cans courses. See Appendix A.

5.6 **CHANGE OF COURSE**

- A committee boat, or signal boat, displaying International Code flags C over “F and a board giving the new mark designation and making repetitive sound signals may be on station near to any rounding mark. The mark designated will be the next mark on the course and shall be the finish. This mark may not have been part of the original course. Boats shall round the mark at which the change of course is displayed and then proceed directly to the mark indicated and finish between it and the nearby Committee Boat. This amends RRS 33.
- A change of course may be announced on the VHF channel.
- At the new finishing line, the Race Committee will not signal a shortened course. This changes RRS 32.2.

5.7 FINISHING LINE

- Unless otherwise stated by the Race Officer, the finish line for Non-Spinnaker Divisions shall be as follows:
- When two races are to be sailed:
 - The first race shall finish in the vicinity of the start line area, unless the race is shortened. The finish line shall be between the red and white pole on the Committee Boat flying a blue flag and an outer distance mark (ODM) which may be a danbuoy.
 - The second race shall finish on the Charles Fort line, unless the race is shortened. The finishing line is between a red and white pole on the Committee Boat flying a blue flag and the lighthouse on Charles Fort.
- When one race is to be sailed:
 - The race shall finish on the Charles Fort line, unless the race is shortened. The finishing line shall be between the red and white pole on the Committee Boat flying a blue flag and the lighthouse on Charles Fort.
